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Abbreviations

continuetro(c)
centimetre(s)
continue
double pointed needles
following
inch(es)
knit
knit two stitches together
purl
purl two stitches together

Pattern Notes


It is often easier to cast on using DPNs before changing to the short circular needle. If you want to use magic loop you will be able to cast on with the larger circular needle if you prefer to do so, but remember not to pull your cast on stitches too tight. If you use DPNs, you might find it easier to cast on and work 2 rows before dividing the stitches across the needles.

When using self-striping yarn to acheve matching socks, start your cast on at the first colour change into the ball, making a note of the colour. Start your second sock at the same point. You will need to pull yarn until you get to the colour you started with.

When working from a chart you will read all rounds from right to left.

Finishing

Once your socks are complete it is essential to block your knitting. Pin your socks out to the size stated in the pattern, cover with a damp cloth and leave to dry.

A – Gingerbread (1109) 1 [1:1:1:2:2:2:2] x 100g

Equipment

3.5mm needles – short circular needle, DPNs or 80cm circular for magic loop
One set of 4mm DPNs (optional for a looser cuff)
One set of 3.5mm DPNs (not required for magic loop)
Stitch holder (optional)
Stitch markers
Wool needle

Tension

20 sts to 10cm (4in) in stocking stitch (worked in the round) using two strands of yarn held together on 3.5mm needles.

Always use the size of needles to achieve the correct tension.

It is essential to work to the stated tension to ensure success.

Pattern Notes

These socks are knitted on 3.5mm needles using two strands of yarn held together, not 3.25mm as stated on the ball band.

This will produce a different tension but will ensure a firmer, more hard-wearing fabric for your socks. The ideal tension for these socks is 20 sts to 10cm (4in) so use whatever size needles are required to reach that tension ,and do check that your knitted fabric is firm but not stiff.

These socks are knitted with two strands of yarn held together throughout. For ease, wind a ball into two 50g balls if your size only takes one ball of yarn. To make sure that your yarns match when you hold them together, pull the yarn from the same end of the ball so that the colours follow the same order. You may find that you need to pull different amounts of yarn from each ball to find the colour match.

Special Abbreviations

Cross3L: With yarn in back slip 3 sts purlwise dropping extra wrap, then with point of needle pass the first stitch over the last 2, return sts to left-hand needle and knit all 3 sts in this crossed order.

Cross3R: With yarn in back slip 3 sts purlwise dropping extra wrap, then slip all 3 sts back to left-hand needle. With point of needle pass the last stitch over the first 2 and knit all 3 sts in this crossed order.

K1wytrn: Wrap yarn twice around needle for next knit stitch.



Cuff

Left Sock

Using two strands of yarn held together, cast on 28 [32:36:36:40:44:48:52] sts **using 4mm DPNs**. The pattern has been written for a cast on with straight needles; if you wish to join into the round straight away, work row 1 twice and omit row 2.

Using two strands of yarn (throughout) work rib as follows:

28 sts

Row 1: (Work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, K1) twice, turn. 28 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

32 sts

Row 1: K1, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, K3, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, K2, turn. 32 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

36 sts

Row 1: (K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, K2, P1) twice, turn. 36 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

40 sts

Row 1: (K3, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, K3, P1) twice, turn. 40 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

44 sts

Row 1: (K1, P1, K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of Chart A, K2, P1, K2) twice, turn. 44 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

48 sts

Row 1: *K2, P1, K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of **Chart A**, (K2, P1) twice, rep from * once more. 48 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

52 sts

Row 1: *(P1, K2) twice, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of Chart A, (K2, P1) twice, K1, rep from * once more. 52 sts.

Row 2: Work all knit and purl stitches as they present themselves, turn.

Change to a 3.5mm short circular needle, magic loop or divide the stitches across **DPNs** and join into a circle, **place marker**. You will sew up the small gap where you knitted the first two rows later.


Continue as set for your size for 6 (6:6:8:8:8:8) more rnds.

Written Instructions

Chart A (13 sts)

Rnds 1–6: (P1, K3) 3 times, P1. 13 sts. **Rnd 7:** (P1, K1wytrn, K2) 3 times, P1. **Rnd 8:** (P1, Cross3L) 3 times, P1. Rnds 1–8 set pattern and should be repeated.

Right Sock


Work as given for Left Sock following **Chart B** instead of **Chart A**.

Written Instructions

Chart B (13 sts)

Rnds 1–6: (P1, K3) 3 times, P1. 13 sts. Rnd 7: (P1, K2, K1wytrn) 3 times, P1. Rnd 8: (P1, Cross3R) 3 times, P1. Rnds 1–8 set pattern and should be repeated.

Leg

Left or Right Sock

Using either **Chart A** for Left Sock or **Chart B** for Right Sock or the written instructions, depending on your size and starting at rnd 1 [1:1:3:3:3:3:3] cont to work each rnd in patt for 10 [10:12:12:15:15:15:17:17]cm; 4 [4:4³/₄:4³/₄:6:6:6:7:7]in from cast on edge, or length preferred. Remember which round you finished on for the pattern panel as you will need this later.

28 sts (14 sts twice)

Rnd 1: (Work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of Chart A or Chart B, K1) twice. 14 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

32 sts (16 sts twice)

Rnd 1: (K1, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of Chart A or Chart B, K2) twice. 16 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

36 sts (18 sts twice)

Rnd 1: (K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 1 of Chart A or Chart B, K2, P1) twice. 18 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

40 sts (20 sts twice)

Rnd 1: (K3, work 13 sts as given for rnd 3 of Chart A or Chart B, K3, P1) twice. 20 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

44 sts (22 sts twice)

Rnd 1: (K1, P1, K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 3 of Chart A or Chart B, K2, P1, K2) twice. 22 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

48 sts (24 sts twice)

Rnd 1: *K2, P1, K2, work 13 sts as given for rnd 3 of Chart A or Chart B, (K2, P1) twice, rep from * once more. 24 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

52 sts (26 sts twice)

Rnd 1: *(P1, K2) twice, work 13 sts as given for rnd 3 of Chart A or Chart B, (K2, P1) twice, K1, rep from * once more. 26 sts.

Rnd 2 and foll rnds: As for rnd 1, following each rnd of Chart A or Chart B.

Heel Flap

All sizes

Change to 3.5mm DPNs if you are using a short circular needle. There is no need to use DPNs if you are using magic loop. You may prefer to place the

spare sts from the top of the foot onto a stitch holder if you are using a short circular or **DPNs** whilst you work the heel.

Row 1: K2, (sl1, P1) until you have 14 [16:18:18:20:22:24:26] sts on your needle, sl1, K1, turn.

Row 2: Sl1, (P1, K1) to last 3 sts, P3, turn.

Row 3: Sl1, K1, (sl1, P1) to last 2 sts, sl1, K1, turn.

Rep rows 2 and 3 until heel measures 5 [5:5:5:5:5:6.5:7.5]cm; 2 [2:2:2:2:2:2:2:2:2:3]in or desired length, finishing on row 3.

Turn Heel

Row 1: Sl1, P7 [8:9:9:10:11:12:13], P2tog, P1, turn.

Row 2: Sl1, K3, SSK, K1, turn.

Row 3: Sl1, P4, P2tog, P1, turn.

Row 4: Sl1, K5, SSK, K1, turn.

Cont in this way, adding one stitch between slip stitch and SSK or P2tog on each row (ie, **Row 5:** Sl1, **P6**, P2tog, P1, turn; **Row 6**: Sl1, **K7**, SSK, K1, turn; etc) until all of the heel stitches are used. Depending on how many sts are in your heel flap, you may find that the K1 and P1 stitch is not required at the end of the last two rows.

Knit across heel stitches if required to bring you to the left-hand side of the heel flap (with the outside of the flap facing you), ready to pick up 1 stitch for every 2 rows of heel flap knitted. Remember that if you made the heel flap bigger, you will need to pick up more stitches. Once you have picked up the stitches, **place marker**.

Knit across the top of the foot sts in pattern from where you finished for the leg, **place marker**, then pick up 1 stitch for every 2 rows of heel flap knitted up the other side of the heel. Knit across the top of the heel and then shape gusset as below.

Note: If you are using DPNs and/or have placed your sts on a stitch holder, you can arrange the needles as follows: Needle 1 for stitches across heel, Needle 2 for picked-up stitches down side of foot, Needle 3 for stitches across top of foot (knit stitches off stitch holder if required), Needle 4 for picked-up stitches on other side of foot. You may find that stitch markers are not required at first.

Shape Gusset

Rnd 1: K to 3 sts before marker, K2tog, K1, **slip marker**, patt to next marker, **slip marker**, K1, SSK, K to marker.

Rnd 2: Slip marker, patt to next marker, slip marker, knit to 3 sts before marker.

Rnd 3: K2tog, K1, slip marker, patt to next marker, slip marker, K1, SSK, K to marker.

Rep rnds 2 and 3 to shape the gusset. Cont in this way, decreasing by 2 sts at the gusset on every other rnd until there are 28 [32:36:36:40:44:48:52] sts on the needle.

Once you have reached the required number of sts, continue to knit each round until you reach 4 [4:4:5:5:5:5:5]cm; 1½ [1½:1½:2:2:2:2:2]in before the desired length ready to start the toes. Don't be afraid to try your sock on before decreasing for the toes.

Toes

Note: Whilst decreasing for the toes, if you are using a short circular needle, you may need to change back to DPNs or use the magic loop method as the number of stitches becomes too small for the circular. It's up to you when you choose to do that, and how you distribute the stitches across the needles; just keep following the pattern as set below.

Create the toes as follows:

Rnd 1: K1, SSK, K8 [10:12:12:14:16:18:20] sts, K2tog, K1, **place marker** (if required), K1, SSK, K8 [10:12:12:14:16:18:20] sts, K2tog, K1. 24 [28:32:32:36:40:44:48] sts.

Rnds 2–3: K to end, slipping markers as you come to them.

Rnds 4-6: Rep rnds 1-3. 20 [24:28:28:32:36:40:44] sts.

Rnd 7: K1, SSK, K to 3 sts before marker, K2tog, K1, **slip marker**, K1, SSK, K to 3 sts before marker, K2tog, K1. 16 [20:24:24:28:32:36:40] sts.

Rnd 8: Knit one rnd, slipping markers as you come to them.

Rep rnds 7 and 8 another 0 [0:1:0:0:1:1:2] times more. You will have 16 [20:20:24:28:28:32:32] sts left. Divide these between two needles so that front and back of socks match.

Graft toes using kitchener stitch, weave in all ends and sew up the small gap at the cuff where you cast on.

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
